Dear Exhibitor,

We can't wait to see you at the Buckeye Haflinger Show! The show will once again be held at the Ashland County Fairgrounds in Ashland, OH. The facility has a large indoor arena and four outdoor arenas. We are also happy to announce that we were once again able to keep the show fees the same as last year. The show will also continue to have the free exhibitor pizza party and fun night on Friday, which was a huge success in seeing all the children playing games, making new friends, having fun with old friends and finding out there is more to showing than just competing. New this year, the OHA Ice Cream Social will take place on Friday in conjunction with the pizza party. Please join us for Pizza AND ice cream on Friday evening!

When the show was founded in 2006 it was said that as long as there were people who wanted to compete and financial support to cover the show, there would be a Buckeye. Once again the Buckeye Show will continue to be part of the Haflinger Championship Challenge. At the end of the season points are tallied together and yearly prizes are awarded in an award presentation.

We are once again bringing you two options for entering! You can enter online (follow the directions listed online at www.haflingerchallenge.com under the Buckeye tab) or, sign up using paper copies and follow these directions: Please sign up for classes using the class entry forms. Fees are listed with each class. Information regarding specific classes can be found either in the show rules or in this show packet. All classes will accept entries up until the gate closes for the class. The late fee is listed with each class and is due for any entries received after June 6th, 2018. Entries must be postmarked by June 6th, 2018 – entries postmarked after that date will be considered late. Mail your entries early! Dressage times will be posted on the haflingerchallenge.com website by June 18th. All show fees must be paid before the show office is closed on Sunday. Outstanding bills will be assessed a \$25 late fee.

We are hoping to increase youth participation this year! In an effort to do so, we have created a category for every youth rider. You'll notice on the class list that there are Leadline classes, Trainer Assisted W/T classes, 10 and Under W/T, and then Youth W/T. For the youths needing the most help, leadline classes allow a handler to be in control of the horse. For the youth who is starting to trot independently, but still requires some help there are Trainer Assisted W/T classes in which a trainer/parent is allowed to be in the ring with the youth helping them to be successful. For youths who are able to trot completely independently, the 10 and Under W/T and the Youth W/T classes provide a space to show off independent skills.

You will notice a number of new classes and high point divisions this year! We hope that everyone can find something about the class list and high point awards that excites them. A list of the awards and qualifying classes are contained within this packet. Also similar to last year, trophies will be given out in each youth class. Show Rules for the Buckeye Haflinger Show

GENERAL INFORMATION :

I. DEFINITIONS

YOUTH COMPETITOR: An individual, who has not reached their 19th birthday as of January 1 of the current competition year. Riders/Driver's age is determined as of January 1 of the current year. Therefore, those 19 or before January 1 are adults. Youths may not show stallions. Approved helmets with retention harness securely fastened must be worn in all classes by all youths 16 and under. Youths 17-18 years of age must wear a securely fastened helmet in all jumping and dressage classes and are highly recommended to wear a helmet in all other classes. Youths cannot cross-enter youth W/T/C and youth W/T classes although cross-entering is allowed into open classes.

GREEN HORSE / GREEN RIDER: An inexperienced horse or rider (typically within their first two years of showing, although if a rider or horse in their third year of showing and beyond still feels inexperienced, they may enter these classes). Green horses and riders MAY cross enter into any other class. For Green Horse/Rider canter classes, the horse or rider must be in their first two years of showing in canter classes (so they can have shown for several years prior in walk/trot classes as long as either the horse or the rider is in their first two years of having moved up to canter classes).

GREEN HORSE / GREEN DRIVER: An inexperienced driver or driving horse (typically within their first two years of showing in driving classes, although if a driver or horse in their third year of showing and beyond still feels inexperienced, they may enter these classes). Green horses and drivers MAY cross enter into any other class.

II. CONDUCT OF SHOWS

GENERAL: Exhibitors must have signed release form on file to enter classes. Exhibitors assume all risk for their belongings, horses and vehicles, while at the show. **SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED** in or near barn/stables. Bedding should be reserved and pre-paid with entry. Patterns will be posted at the show office no less than one hour prior to class. Ribbons will be awarded to 8 places in all classes. A wide variety of high points and reserve high point awards will be given. See additional bulletin contained within this packet for more details. No refunds will be given for missed or cancelled classes without a veterinary or physician's written excuse. All exhibitors are asked to check out at the show office prior to leaving the grounds. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter W/T and W/T/C classes.

DROP/ADD RULES: A rider **or** horse may be switched (substituted) in a pre-registered class with no penalty. If making both a horse **and** rider substitution in a class or if dropping one class and immediately adding another, the difference between the pre-entry fee and post-entry fee will be charged (i.e., for an \$8 class, a \$2 fee will be charged).

HAFLINGER CHAMPIONSHIP CHALLENGE: Haflinger Championship Challenge (HCC) qualifying classes are listed in **bold print** and have a © next to the class number. All entries in those classes are automatically entered in the HCC. HCC High-Point Winners will be announced and prizes presented in October.

GAMES: Well-fitting tack required. Full dress not required. Breeches/jeans, heeled boots, chaps, helmets acceptable. Open to all participants regardless of W/T or W/T/C status.

DRESSAGE: Dressage is exempt from normal W/T and W/T/C status rules. W/T/C riders new to English or Western dressage may enter W/T dressage classes. Dressage entries will be guaranteed 2 test times with additional rides scheduled on a first come, first serve basis as time permits. Readers permitted at all levels. USDF rules apply. Dressage times available after June 18th on the haflingerchallenge.com website.

TRAIL: Trail will run at will between the hours of 1p.m. and 5 p.m. Friday only. Exhibitors are asked to make their way to the trail ring at anytime during those hours. More than one handler may not exhibit the same horse in the same trail class. Trail will close at 5 p.m. or when all entries have shown, whichever is sooner. **Exhibitors may not practice on trail pattern prior to class.**

IN-HAND/HALTER: Horses must enter respective halter class in order to participate in championship halter classes. Horses to be shown on the triangle.

YOUTH CLASSES: Check definition of youth listed above. Youths may cross enter Youth classes and open classes. Youths designated at W/T may not cross enter W/T/C classes. Youth drivers under the age of 16 must have a qualified adult in the vehicle at all times. Youth 16-18 may have an adult accompany them in the carriage without penalty.

WESTERN RIDING: Chaps are optional in BOTH pleasure and horsemanship classes. Horses aged five (5) and under may be ridden two-handed in a snaffle bridle. Horses over the age of 5 must be ridden one-handed in a curb bit.

DRIVING: ADS guidelines will be used. Single & multiple driven turnouts show together. Proper fitting pleasure harness and attire (apron, whip, hat, gloves) is expected in all driven classes (excluding obstacle classes). Each horse may be shown only once in each driving class. No horse will be permitted to enter the same obstacle class more than once. Exhibitors will be allowed time to walk the course, however, at no time are horses to drive obstacle course prior to exhibiting. Wheels will not be measured. All obstacles will be set the same distance apart for all exhibitors regardless of wheel width. At no time shall the bridle be removed from the horse, nor the horse be left unattended, while put to a vehicle. Gaits shown will include walk, slow trot, working trot, strong trot, halt and rein back.

JUMPING: Jumping is exempt from normal W/T and W/T/C status rules. W/T/C riders new to Jumping may enter W/T jumping classes. Same horse/rider combination may enter two consecutive divisions. Hunter Classes to be judged according to Hunter rules, Jumpers Classes to be judged according to Jumpers rules.

ENGLISH RIDING: Martingales, wraps, boots are not permitted in any flat classes.

INQUIRIES & ETIQUETTE: At no time are judges to be asked questions directly during show hours. All questions regarding show rules, acceptable tack, etc., are to be directed to the Technical Delegate (TD), available at the show office. The TD will be available for rules clarification throughout show hours. Show Management reserves the right to excuse any individual displaying misconduct. Judges' decisions are final.

SHOW SCHEDULE: Classes will be called in the order they appear in the show program, excepting the trail classes, which will run concurrently with the dressage classes. If it becomes necessary to cancel or reschedule any class, the change must be announced at least thirty minutes prior to the affected class to allow adequate preparation time for the next scheduled class.

DELAY OF CLASSES: When the start of any class requiring horses to be shown individually or collectively is delayed by horses not ready to perform, the class may be closed at the order of the Judge or Show Manager provided a warning is issued and the competitor(s) is given five minutes to appear at the in-gate ready to participate. The Ring Master will give the warning to the announcer as to when the gates will be closed for the class. Tack changes should be built into the schedule but if necessary a five minute tack hold will be permitted upon previous arrangement with the Ring Master or Show Secretary. If a class is in progress and must be stopped due to an accident or other emergency, the Show Manager will decide whether to recommence the class. If it becomes necessary to interrupt a dressage competition for any reason, the unfinished portion may be rescheduled and resumed on the same day at the option of the Show Manager with the Judge's consent. All scores recorded before the interruption will stand.

DIVISION OF LARGE CLASSES: The Judge or management may split large classes if conditions warrant. The size of the ring and the number of entries will determine when a class should be split. In a small ring, classes may be split at a lower number. The Judge or management has the discretion as to how the division is to be made, keeping in mind the safety of competitors. Final placing can be determined by working off selected entries from each section.

ENTRY NUMBERS: All entries must have a number before entering any class. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to display the proper number for the correct entry in each class. It is not unusual for exhibitors to have more than one number for a show, due to the fact that they may have more than one entry in a class and each entry will have a separate number. The Judge or Management has the discretion to disqualify any competitor while displaying an incorrect number or not displaying a number. No time will be given to correct or add numbers once the class is called and the gates are closed.

ATTIRE: All Exhibitors/Competitors/Technical delegates and show officials in the show ring will wear clothing appropriate to the class or duties performed.
